

Foster Homes

Our foster families provide life-changing support for our special needs companion animals.

We provide the veterinary care, behavioral support, foster training, and anything else our animal may need - you provide the safe, caring home environment.

Animals that qualify for foster homes:

- **Stressed Animals:** Sometimes our animals have a hard time adapting to shelter life, and while they're still great and perfectly adoptable, they'd be best suited in a home environment rather than being here at the shelter.

- **Young Animals:** Puppies and kittens less than 8 weeks of age. This also includes nursing mothers and her puppies or kittens. At such young ages, animals under 8 weeks can be incredible susceptible to conditions that otherwise wouldn't really affect a more mature animal.

- **Injured or Sick Animals:** Animals with temporary but treatable health problems, such as those with fractures, wounds, or are under-weight. These animals are by no means unadoptable, but we take their care very seriously and want them in the most nurturing environment possible.

- **Animals for Overpopulation:** Healthy animals for whom there is no space in the shelter. This also includes animals going to breed rescue.

- Any other animal deemed appropriate by shelter management

Please keep in mind that fostering an animal can be a longer termed commitment. We want our fosters to understand that the animals in their care could be as time consuming as any regular animal you may have in your home. Foster families must be willing to do their part to make contact with potential adopters.
